BLESSINGS TREE: The early elementary class has been learning about blessings and missions. They are doing a beginning mission project here in the church. The project is giving everyone a chance to reflect on one or more blessings they feel and thanking God for those blessings. In the Narthex on one of the door side windows you will find a paper tree and background. There's a basket of paper leaves, pens, glue, and tape. We hope you will feel inspired to write down one or more blessings on the leaves and glue or tape them on the blessings tree poster as a thank you prayer. The kids have gotten us started with their own blessing leaves.



The following are new developments in the Director position. The Education Team has altered the position expectations and description in the following ways. The position will be a flexible 15 hour per week position with salary being up to \$18,000.00 per year. Otherwise, the job description would be substantially the same with some outreach expectations eliminated. We will be carefully looking at ways to finance the position in 2026 including applying for a Dinwiddie grant and tapping Shaub/Whitney funds. At present the Team still has funds in its budget to pay for the position in 2025. We have been interviewing candidate for the revised position.

Mission News

2025 Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering

During the month of December, we contribute to a special thank you offering for our American Baptist retired ordained ministers and commissioned missionaries and their surviving widowed spouses. A certain portion of the funds is also allocated for direct emergency relief. With gift revenue from the RRMO 2024 offering, ABCUSA distributed 3,331 thank you checks averaging \$174, a modest amount in which the gesture says far more than the dollars. The theme this year is Worthy of Love from 1 cor.16:14 "let all that you do be done in love". In 2024, First Baptist gave \$343.50. Reverends David O'Brien, Reid Trulson, and Jeff Middleton will be among the recipients. For all the blessings they've brought us, together let's remember them again this year.

UGB MEETING

The UGB group met on Monday, November 17th. The outreach team communicated their readiness for the Thanksgiving Food drive. The Fellowship team noted new and repeat visitors coming for Sunday Service. The music team reported being prepared for the Advent and Christmas season, particularly after the generous donation of an additional drum set by Matt Little. The education team team is continuing interviews with a potential director, and the property team has reduced patrols thanks to lowered activity outside the church and the addition of security cameras. A potential renter for the children's room was discussed, as well as sharing the new logo with new merchandise. The archives team advocated for secure offsite backups for all our digital records and quotes are being collected for different options regarding storage. The financial secretary's report was approved, as was the treasurer's report. Various information is being gathered before finalizing the 2026 budget. Looking forward, there are plans for a Tuba concert on Church St. December 13th. FBC has been made available as a back-up location in case of inclement weather. Christmas caroling logistics were discussed and it was announced that the new website has been partially launched. Finally, thanks to all the volunteers that handled the greening of the church was expressed.
