TRAVELING WITH JESUS

This Fall we have been traveling with Jesus through the Gospel of Luke. He has shared challenging parables and teachings about how we use our resources, how we treat the vulnerable, and how we see ourselves as part of God's beloved creation. It has been fortifying to be reminded of our Scriptural foundations and our core identities as children of God. At times it has been uncomfortable as we recognize aspects of our secular culture which are at odds with our understanding of God's vision.

Last month, I proposed a lens for moving through these challenging times - Bearing Witness and Living Joy. Jesus calls us to pay attention to what is going on around us and to act accordingly with courage and conviction. Scripture insists that we care for the stranger. Our historic Baptist principles insist that we stand up for the freedom of speech and the freedom to worship for all faith traditions. This may put us at odds with our neighbors. Jesus also calls us to live with joy and gratitude for the incredible blessings that surround us each day. It is too easy to become overwhelmed by the suffering in this world. Our goal is to find a balance between caring for others and caring for ourselves, all while resting in the love and providence of God at all times and in all circumstances.

This newsletter contains opportunities for bearing witness and living joy through worship, fellowship, and service. It is a great blessing to be in ministry with you.

September UGB Meeting 09/15/25

Outreach -We discussed the details of the I89 Rest Stop Fundraiser The team's budget for next year will be done by Sept. 20. We the need to address the CE/Mission Director's hourly rate and advertising costs. A meeting with other key members to discuss raising the salary rate was planned..

Fellowship- It is great to have the choir back and several new attendees, including one who indicated interest in joining the church and two students. The first weekend in October is World Communion Sunday and Ushers are needed. Communion servers are all set.

Education - The opening of Church School was a good kickoff for the year. The youth class has requested another fall retreat at Inselheim. There is \$533.43 left over from the backpack collection. We will buy more backpacks.

Property - Increased police presence and Chocolate Thunder's patrols have helped reduce drug activity and other action in the area. A plan was presented to use \$10,111.55 from undesignated TPF funds for 7 cameras covering various exterior areas, a monitor and desk to put the NVR on. After extensive discussion by the group, a motion was made to ask the congregation for approval of that use of the undesignated TPF funds with a vote on October 12. The motion passed with 8 votes in favor and 1 abstention. The potential fence installation was deferred for the time being. Regarding Bank St property, VT CARES has renewed their lease. The committee has concerns about increased snow plowing and landscaping costs.

Financial Reports - The Financial Secretary's report showed we are under budget for income in both local and mission funds, but lower expenses were balancing things out. In discussion of the Treasurers report, there was some further discussion about expenses for the CE position, which had been split between the local fund and mission fund. The TPF Report including updates on the portfolio. We are receiving acceptable growth. The team is watching purchasing power. We are planning now for the stewardship campaign later in the Fall.

Pastor's Report - Karen updated events coming up: resumption of coffee hours, Bible study, Book group, an all church hike, Dopp organ recital Oct 12, All Saints Day, Pledge Sunday, Thanksgiving Sunday Nov 23 and First Sunday of Advent Nov 30 and other events noted in previous reports. She will join the Generosity Project (ABC) Sept 23, an informational webinar about stewardship and generosity in our churches. The Thriving Program Team (an enlarged group from the earlier Task Force) will reconvene to work on an application for the Thriving Congregations Initiative.

Church School News

Sunday school is progressing. You may occasionally hear thumps during worship. The Early Education Classroom is directly above the narthex and the class frequently has physical movement activities as part of the lesson. Movement is important for this age group and some noise is unavoidable. It's the sign of energy, life and spirit.

Jointly with Outreach Team members we have been reviewing the part-time staff position we are now calling Director of Family Ministries and Outreach. Last Winter/Spring we created a job description approved by the Unified Governing Board. We made an unsuccessful recruitment effort at that time. The joint committee is reviewing the job description and salary and have discussed funding issues. We plan to present a proposal to the UGB at the next meeting. Meanwhile the Education team, Cindy L, Lois L and Bev N. and Pastor Karen are working on programming and providing other support for the fall and winter.

OCTOBER IS "IM'S WORLD MISSION OFFERING MONTH AT FIRST BAPTIST":

Here are some reflections from Rev. Dr. Sharon Koh, Executive Minister/CEO of International Ministries using Luke 24:32-34 "were not our hearts burning within us". Our global servants go at the invitation of international partners, and many of you, our ministry partners, not only go but go back (not only give, but give again and again).
